### CONSTRUCTION SITES

#### Investments in the water supply

As the main water pipes between the water wells next to the football pitch and the water basin *Deiwelsteller* on Route de Larochette are outdated, the municipality has decided to invest in the town's water supply. Preparatory work began in February, including the felling of trees, in order to replace the old water pipes leading to the water reservoir on Route de Larochette. The main work is scheduled to begin in early March.



### MUNICIPAL PROJECTS

#### #NeiDikrich Competition

In October 2025 the competition for architects and urban planners for the #NeiDikrich project was launched. At the beginning of February a jury of nine experts and politicians shortlisted five firms, which have until 5 June 2026 to develop a detailed proposal for the renewal of the town centre. In early July, the jury will then decide who emerges as the definitive winner of the competition. On 14 July 2026, the winning project will be publicly presented. Afterwards, the municipal council must simply vote on the project before it can be implemented.



#### Participatory budgeting 2025 & 2026

At the end of January, the local council decided on one of the approximately 20 projects submitted as part of the 2025 participatory budget. Mr Gilberto Dos Santos' proposal was selected – it involves renovating the basketball court at *Lëmmelsplaz* and installing new equipment to promote outdoor activities and social interaction. A big thank you to Mr Dos Santos and everyone else who submitted their ideas. A participatory budget is also planned for 2026, for which you can submit your proposals. ## Tree planting initiative

From 16 February until the end of the month, the technical department will plant 40 trees throughout the town of Diekirch in order to improve the local climate. As climate change is leading to increasingly dry and hot summers, it is necessary to plant tree species that are adapted to these new weather conditions. That is why you can now and in the future discover new species throughout Diekirch, such as sequoias, ginkgos and other resistant species. Five new trees have been planted on the slope next to the playground on Rue Glaesener.

### Discontinuation of Smarty+

Creos, in collaboration with Luxembourg electricity distribution network operators Ville de Diekirch, Ville d'Ettelbruck and SudStroom, announces the discontinuation of the Smarty+ dongle on 31 December 2026. This decision comes amid technological developments marked by the rollout of new solutions offering broader access to energy consumption data, notably via the Leneda data platform and equipment integrated into home energy management systems (HEMS).



For current users, the dongle and application will continue to function without restriction until the end of 2026, with after-sales service provided during this period. The data collected will also remain accessible until that date.

→ With your Energy ID, you have access to the national energy data platform [www.leneda.lu](http://www.leneda.lu), where you can view and analyse your electricity and gas consumption data (and potentially water and heat data in the future).
