Padel courts

Cité Militaire

At the Cité Militaire, the construction project comprising six small new buildings offering affordable housing and a very large mixed-use building entered a new phase in mid-April. Following the demolition of the old military housing in 2023/24, water, sewerage, electricity and district heating pipes are now being installed for the new buildings. The temporary parking spaces at the Cité Militaire will remain in place until further notice.

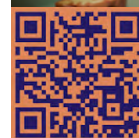
Safety for the elderly

The aim of this event is to boost the sense of security among our older residents.



GetBrainHealthy

The Social Affairs and Senior Citizens' Committee is also pleased to announce that the GetBrainHealthy team from the University of Luxembourg will be visiting Diekirch three times this year to run workshops. During these interactive workshops, which will be held in three languages, participants will learn how to proactively look after their brains. The first two workshops, in French and Portuguese, will take place on **12 and 20 May** in the primary school's meeting room, from **6 pm to 8 pm**. The final workshop, in Luxembourgish, will be held on the morning of **6 June, from 10 am to 12 noon**, at the same venue. The invitation is open to young people and working-age adults. Places are limited. It is therefore advisable to register via the QR code shown in the image on the page.



Luxembourg Museum Days

Lumudays 2026 will take place on **16 and 17 May**, when museums across the country will be open free of charge. As part of this, the museums in Diekirch have also planned special activities. At the MH[s]D History Museum, an event will take place from 10 am to 6 pm, during which you can discover lots of interesting facts about the Romans. On Sunday morning, a creative workshop on the theme of the Romans is also planned with illustrator Samantha Stankiewicz. In the garden in front of the entrance and around the old church, a major arts event is scheduled for the afternoon on both days. Artists Lina Hédo, Aleksandra Ratkovic, Two Cans and Coopérations asbl from Wiltz will take you on a journey into the world of art and guarantee plenty of entertainment with live painting, an open-air exhibition and workshops. And of course, don't miss the chance to visit the new exhibition at the municipal gallery. There you'll discover the world of the famous spotted dog Pimpa. The Lumudays weekend ends on Sunday at 5 pm with a lovely concert at the old church featuring musicians Maurice Clement and Alessandro Urbano.



Micro-Wednesday

Following on from Literary Wednesday, the municipality is launching the first series of *De Mikro-Mëttwoch* in May, in collaboration with the MH[s]D History Museum. Unlike the readings, this series focuses on more informal performances, featuring singing, improvisational theatre and poetry slam, once a month on Wednesdays. Musicians Thomas Roland (Maale Gars) and Laurie Ndzana (ZANA) will kick things off on **20 May**. Before the show, they will also lead a singing and songwriting workshop. CLIMATE NEWS

Bin bags

In 2025, the municipality of Diekirch used 3,181 kilograms of *We Think* brand bin bags. The municipality thus aims to deliberately offer a sustainable alternative, actively contribute to a significant reduction in the consumption of virgin plastic and highlight its pioneering role in sustainability. *We Think* bags are made from 100% recycled materials and reduce CO₂ emissions by 78% compared to new bin bags. Thanks to the contribution from the municipality of Diekirch, **570,025 litres of water, 47,969 kWh of energy, 5,726 litres of crude oil and 15,809 kg of CO₂** were saved last year.



→ The reduction of **15,809 kg of CO₂** is equivalent to planting **632 trees**.
